## Today's Scripture Passage: Galatians 6:11-18

<sup>11</sup>See what large letters I use as I write to you with my own hand! <sup>12</sup>Those who want to make a good impression outwardly are trying to compel you to be circumcised. The only reason they do this is to avoid being persecuted for the cross of Christ. <sup>13</sup>Not even those who are circumcised obey the law, yet they want you to be circumcised that they may boast about your flesh. <sup>14</sup>May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. <sup>15</sup>Neither circumcision nor uncircumcision means anything; what counts is a new creation. <sup>16</sup>Peace and mercy to all who follow this rule, even to the Israel of God.

<sup>17</sup>Finally, let no one cause me trouble, for I bear on my body the marks of Jesus.

<sup>18</sup>The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit, brothers. Amen.

## Questions:

- 1. Vs. 12:
  - A. What can we compare with circumcision today?
  - B. What do we do that sometimes is accepted widely or (politically correct) but not accepted by God?
- 2. Vs. 13: What are things that are accepted widely by the world standard and Christians find pressure or forced to accept them or regard them as "biblical standards?"
- 3. Vs. 14: What makes possible to have all that are against God (the world) die to you and you to the world?
- 4. Vs. 15: Why do Christians believe new creation is a transformation that results in an entirely new being?
- 5. Vs. 17: What does the word "mark of Jesus" mean to us today? What could be marks of Jesus in our lives today?
